

News Flash: Colorado gets hit with 2nd major snowstorm of the season. Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula get more warm temps and rain followed by dry and bitter cold. Once again our season got off to a slow start due to the mild weather. Fortunately some timely low temperatures for snowmaking and a couple good snowstorms provided enough snow for some very good skiing, and very good crowds at the local ski areas over the holidays. The Porkie's was the only area to lack enough snow to open for the holidays, but are now open due to more natural snowfall closer to "the lake".

Ski areas in our section continue to make improvements. Mount Ashwabay has added some new runs and will complete the installation of a new chairlift this summer. They

also have expanded the cross country ski trails at the complex as well. Jeff Skoraczewski (PR) credits a lot of volunteer help from members of the patrol and others for accomplishing these improvements.

Big Powderhorn Mountain has also added a new run this year (Katie's Catwalk), and Blackjack has added an awesome new terrain park at the top of the Spillway run.

Section One will again host the Senior evaluations, which will be held February 24-25 at Indianhead Mountain. Lodging will be available at Blackjack for candidates and evaluators on a limited basis at \$45/ night. Please contact the lodging office (906 229-5115) to make reservations.
