All services are now being provided out the Caribou Lodge, which is the same building that has and continues to house the patrol room. I think this was a remarkable effort by all involved, and we can all look forward to seeing a new lodge in place next year!

I also had the pleasure to present Laura Olson-Davig with the Patrollers Cross award on January 14, 2011 during a gathering of her fellow patrollers in the Indianhead Mountain patrol room. Laura seriously injured her back a year earlier (Jan. 17, 2010) while on patrol at Blackjack. Laura was the PR at the time and was trying to remove an injured guest by toboggan from deep powder, off to the side of Spillway headwall. This injury ended her patrolling season, and one year later she is still unable to return to normal patrol activities. We all wish Laura the best in her recovery from this injury, and look forward to seeing Laura patrolling again in the future!

Good news from Brady. They are 100% sure they will meet the April 27 deadline. They are trying to get this approximate 1250 page book in the hands of our ROAs, ITs and Instructors a couple of weeks before April 27th.

Retail cost of the book will be \$89.00

Patroller Cost

- First year the book is on the market will be 25% off the retail cost= \$65.60
- Second year the book is on the market it will be \$70 for registered members and instructors will still be \$65.60.
- The E-Book is \$44.00; however it is not an entire book download, but rather a page at a time (1250 pages).

All OEC classes using the 4th edition must be completed by May 1, 2010. That is the final date the test bank and materials will support the 4th edition. No certification will be given from the National Office beginning on May 2nd for 4th edition classes. A new class using the 5th edition will need to begin to attain certification. We were told there are no exceptions. We encourage you to hold off on new OEC classes until the 5th edition is

out. If you must, and you can complete an OEC course between now and May 1, 2010 you may register the class, however as of today you only have 15 weeks to complete the course and it is the middle of our ski season! Something to consider, some candidates could be put in the position of purchasing a 4th edition text, paying the course registration fee then within a few short months purchasing the 5th edition. This has the potential of being a big burden on our new patrollers.

Our 5th edition will meet the needs of the patroller and other outdoor emergency care professionals in the ever changing field of emergency medicine using evidence based medicine. It will promote quality assurance via medical leadership from National to the patrol level. Quality assurance is the best method to insure treatments rendered by patrollers meets or exceeds the national standards for emergency personnel. In the near future we will be working closely with our Division Medical Advisor, Dr. Steve Werner, as well as other medical personnel throughout the Region, Section and Patrols to validate the quality care we deliver to our patients. We will continue to update you as we move toward developing and working within the NSP Quality Assurance program.

5. Senior Patroller status should be attained.

Duties and Responsibilities

- 1. Serves three year term
2. Promotes financial support of the national organization and its programs.
3. Cooperates with Region Director and other NSP officers in maintaining rules, regulations and standards of the NSP.
4. Submits timely annual financial and administrative reports to the Region Director.
5. Facilitates communication to and from the Region Director, patrols and patrollers.
6. Authors articles and reports for Section/Region newsletters.

- 7. Is responsible for any other duties designated by Division/Board of Governors.

Nomination Procedure

Any active patroller in good standing may nominate or make a self nomination. Fill out form below and send to Region Elections Coordinator. Form must be post marked by March 18, 2011.

Electorate

The Electorate, having one vote each, consists of Unit Representatives as of December 31, 2010.
