## Region Director's Report

Welcome to summer and our off time season right well this gives me time to address an issue that is dear to me so please hang with me as I address this topic and try to read it in entirety.

COC (chain of command) is an effective tool to maintain order and assign accountability even in the most casual working environments. There are reasons to go against the grain, but even going over the leader's head includes utilizing the built-in protocol.

### Organizational Flow Chart

An organizational flow chart provides a visual structure of who is responsible in each area for assigned duties and who they report to with problems and personal accommodations based on health and other personal issues. It is the responsibility of those in charge to create a solution that will continue the workflow with as few interruptions as possible.

### Military Influence

The chain of command in the military has been used as the model in the work place. Even small companies have a similar type of structure to indicate responsibilities and job descriptions. The similarities are not coincidental, every business model adheres to true and tried principles and no organization works more cohesively and productively than the military.

There are several exceptions in modern companies that strive to create an atmosphere of casual and organic flow, but even in these companies, the end game is to get results and realize profits through teamwork. Taking these companies at face value without looking beyond the surface could be problematic since even the most relaxed and flexible work environment has the expectation of productivity and cooperation.

### **Importance**

Anyone who has worked for a short period of time in an office, warehouse, assembly line, factory or fast food restaurant knows that there is a pecking order to be observed and adhered to. The human resources department does the job of reviewing applications, interviewing, hiring and ensuring the new hires are fully informed of their duties, responsibilities and benefits. Within this process, the new hires know who their supervisor or boss is. This is the first line of entry into the company and the chain of command is clearly established at this point.

In ski patrol you are interviewed accepted into patrol where training starts, you are tested, pass, become a patroller, then more training till you retire. Along the path you should go through the bylaws, policies and procedures along with the organizational flow charts to learn where it all fits into place. The main thing is that everyone in the organization reports to someone with a higher position and greater responsibilities. A patroller would not go to the national chair to request a change at the patrol level. A patroller should also not go over the Patrol Rep to management as this can create a problem of micro managing the patrol from management, where the PR may get missed then only a small faction of patrollers may hear of changes. If all follow the COC the patrol should keep running smoothly. Structure creates order and makes the various duties assigned to a multitude of patrollers manageable and clear to all involved.

### **Responsibilities and Consequences**

If the chain isn't being followed the reasons could be as follows.

- The patroller has no respect for the structure that is in place.
- The patroller is a troublemaker.
- The patroller is looking to advance in the patrol without following procedures or earning the position.
- The patroller is a back-stabber.

### **Consequences:**

- Engenders a lack of trust among co-patrollers and higher-ups.
- Overlooked for promotions or better assignments.
- Patrol environment becomes tense.
- Reputation earned is not positive.

This type of situation reflects poorly on the leader as well.

- The leader does not communicate clearly.
- The leader is not aware of what is going on.
- The leader does not do his job.
- The leader has no leadership skills.

Following the chain of command to achieve resolutions is the first step in following procedures.

There are circumstances in which bypassing the chain of command is unavoidable. Weak or ineffective links in the chain that put people in harm's way knowingly or create a hostile work environment due to abuse of power are such instances.

Even within the perimeters of these scenarios, there is a chain of command. An abusive leader may be reported to the next level, which in turn will pass the information to the leader to correct the situation. If corrective action

is not taken in a timely manner, there are additional steps to document and submit that now involve more people in the chain of command.

This is a lot of information and you may be asking what does this have to do with us in ski patrol. Well we also need to follow our COC (chain of command) to keep our organization communication flowing properly for the same reasons that the military or companies need the COC. We in ski patrol have seen issues arising as of late with improper following of COC and it is hurting our great organization; it needs to stop now. Our chain of command is as follows: In the local patrol it goes like this

1. Management
2. Patrol Rep
3. Assistant PR
4. Slope leaders/shift leader/ program administrators (OEC and on hill)
5. Instructors
6. Patrollers

The flow chart at the region level is as follows

Region BOD (board made up of P Reps ARD's and RD)

1. Region Director
2. Assistant RD (3)
3. Section Chiefs(4)
4. Region Administrators and supervisors
5. Patrol reps from areas

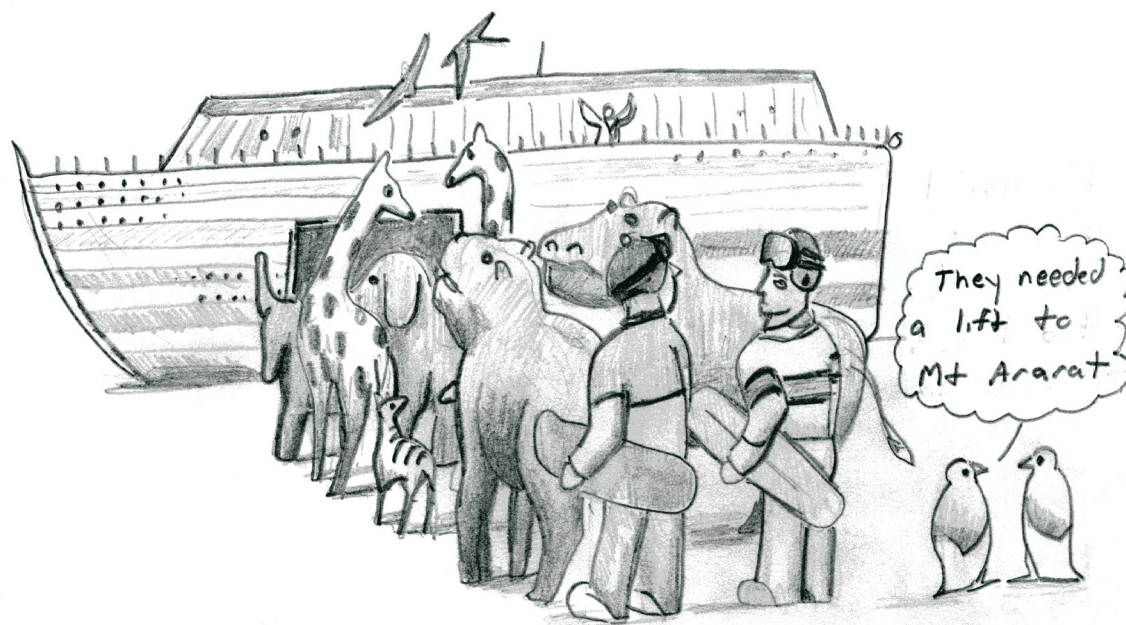
As she hands it to me she says, "You know, I don't think you are a minuteman. I think in real life you are a pirate."

Today's tip: TRIAGE a multiple casualty incident with two or more patients or the number of patients exceeds the resources available.

Incident Commander – Person in charge of the operation, who's responsibility includes initiating a plan, delegating others/teams to call for other resources, triaging, providing emergency care, documenting, generating staging areas and other needs specific to the situation. Communications is an important link with your own staff, resort management and supporting emergency sources.

Review the START (Simple Triage And Rapid Treatment) component of triage. Simple Triage will be completed with the 30-2-CAN DO assessment. Respirations above or below 30 seconds – 2 second capillary refill bench mark – CAN DO assessment for the Level of Responsiveness. This simple triage will place each patient in one of the four ID-ME categories. Review chapter 4 of the 5th edition OEC book for more information.

### **Last Chance OEC Refresher at MWP November 3rd**

Is it time to start thinking about OEC refresher? Again this year there will be an OEC Refresher at Minocqua Winter Park on Sunday, November 3. Don't wait until the last minute. Be sure to contact Betty Adams (see PR of MWP) if you plan to attend. We need to know how many to prepare for. Please, this is very important! We do sell lunch so we need to know how many to prepare for. The refresher will be held and you are welcome. We enjoy providing for everyone. The most frequently asked question is How do you get to MWP?

You should follow these directions for excellent cross country skiing and the OEC refresher. Drive west on Highway 70 from the intersection with Highway 51 in Minocqua. About 6.8 miles west turn left on Squirrel Lake Road. There is a brown Minocqua Winter Park sign on Highway 70 marking the road. About 4.7 miles on Squirrel Lake Road then turn left on Scotchmans Lake Road (it is gravel). There is a large MWP sign on the corner. Go 0.3 of a mile then turn right – again there

is a sign. Go 0.2 of a mile then turn left through a gate and continue to the parking lot. The address is 7543 Squirrel Hill Road, Minocqua, WI 54548.

The refresher will start at 9 A.M. and continue until around 4 P.M. The kitchen will be open with a limited selection for lunch or you can bring your own lunch and beverage. There will be a charge for snack bar lunch, but not for the refresher. If you have questions on November 3 call Minocqua Winter Park at 715-356-3309; otherwise, call Betty Adams at 715-588-7731. We did some brain storming this past year on the NCR Senior program and have implemented some major changes, mainly to the OEC side of Senior.

The OEC clinic will still be held at ski Brule; however, it will be held on October 26th. This is a mandatory clinic for the Senior OEC evaluation. The sign-up dead line has been moved up also to October 19th, so check the sign-up sheet.

We have a new person heading up Senior training for the Region. James Hughes from Indianhead will be in charge of training and oversee the training of our OEC Senior evaluators, OEC Senior trainers and candidates. This is a large task we hope it will bring candidates greater success on the OEC Senior evaluations in the future. Mike Olson is the new Senior OEC administrator overseeing the program. Chuck Jonas is the new Senior Alpine administrator. Please welcome the new staff in their new positions!

To clarify some information, the Alpine Senior clinic is also a mandatory clinic. 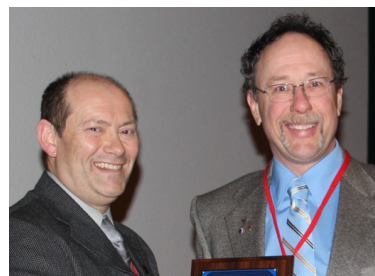
