

Herein lies the problem. In spite of being only average in height I have oft been defeated in limbo contests by those much taller than I. However, the confident brain crowded out the reasonable brain and my arm lifted my ski pole to engage the lift line rope.

My effort to limbo under the rope was nearly successful save for about a heads worth of length. The rope caught my neck and then angled up to my nose and quickly clotheslined me to the ground as if I had been illegally tackled in a professional football game. Unfortunately for me, I am not of pro football-player stature.

Ouch.

I did manage to gain my footing and reattach skis to the rounding applause of the audience. Their attention, of course, at my expense rather than to cheer my skill. Lesson learned. No more cheating beneath lift line ropes.

Then, it began to snow and the rest of the trip was filled with great snow and great times. Ski season might just live up to expectations after all. Pays to be an optimist.

In ski patrol there are many awards.

Candidates can receive local, section, and some region level awards. Patrollers can receive local, section, region, division, and national level awards.

Local awards can be presented to patrollers and candidates for many different functions within a patrol.Section awards can be presented to patrollers or candidates in the section for service done at section or local levels. Region awards can be for exceptional service done by patrollers at either local or region levels.Division awards can be for outstanding contributions of patrollers at local, region and division level. National awards are given to patrollers for extraordinary service and leadership in NSP credentialed programs.

There are two basic categories of awards- awards recognizing specific achievements and honorary awards recognizing career leadership and achievement.

AWARDS RECOGNIZING SPECIFIC ACHEIVEMENTS

Certificates of Appreciation: awards presented to patrollers or candidates recognizing specific accomplishments during the past ski season or for longer term service.

Certificates of Appreciation can be from local, section, region, division or National levels.

Service Recognition Awards: certificates and pins recognize patrollers who have served the NSP for 5 years or longer and are given in increments of five years.

Division Director's Award: Awarded to patrollers who the Central Division Director deems to have provided exceptional service to the Central Division.

Central Division Program Award: awarded yearly to patrollers in the Central Division who have offered the most valuable service to each of the 18 Central Division programs.

Central Division Outstanding Instructor: awarded annually to the most valuable Instructor Trainer in the Central Division.

Central Division Outstanding Supervisor: Awarded annually to the most valuable Central Division program supervisor.

Outstanding Patrol Awards

Region, Division, and National Outstanding Large Alpine Patrol

Region, Division, and National Outstanding Small Alpine Patrol

Region, Division, and National Outstanding Nordic Patrol

Outstanding Patroller Awards

Region, Division, and National Outstanding Alpine Patroller; Region, Division, and National Outstanding Nordic Patroller; Region, Division, and National Outstanding Patroller; Region, Division, and National Outstanding; OEC Instructor Region, Division, and National Outstanding Instructor; Region, Division, and National Outstanding Administrative Patroller; Region, Division, and National Outstanding

Yellow Merit Stars: (a) awarded for all Division Outstanding Patroller categories, (b) awarded for outstanding service by a patroller in an NSP discipline, (c) awarded for outstanding assistance by a patroller in a lifesaving scenario.

Unit Citation Award: (a) awarded to patrols with special accomplishments such as 50 years of operation.

Meritorious Service Award: awarded for exceptional service to a retiring Region or Division supervisor or advisor.

Green Merit Star: awarded to a patroller for heroic arduous and hazardous rescue.

Purple Merit Star: awarded to a patroller for directly saving a life using OEC approved interventions.

Blue Merit Star: awarded to a patroller for (a) outstanding support of a Purple Merit Star or (b) for a heroic attempt to save a life where the patient does not survive for 24 hours.

Patroller's Cross: awarded to a patroller who is seriously injured in the course of ski patrol duty.

Central Division Critical Care Award: awarded to a Central Division patroller for assessment and care using OEC training and skills that recognizes and treats a patient with a great potential for life threatening injuries and illness.

HONORARY AWARDS

National Appointment: award for senior alpine, senior Nordic, or certified patrollers for outstanding long term leadership and involvement in NSP credentialed programs.

Leadership Commendation Appointment: award for Senior Auxiliary Patrollers for outstanding long term leadership and involvement in NSP credentialed programs.

Distinguished Service Award: awarded to senior, basic, or certified patrollers who have a minimum of 20 years of service to the NSP and have demonstrated long term leadership to NSP credentialed programs.

Central Division Lifetime Achievement Award: awarded to a Central Division patroller who has over 30 years of service and has demonstrated high levels of continuous leadership over at least a 15 year period of time.

Sage Award: awarded to the oldest active patroller at Region or Division level.

Angel Pin: award presented by local patrols or regions, recognizing spouses of patrollers for their support of their significant others' NSP activities.

Nordic Notes By: Betty Adams, Nordic Administrator



It was a cold time in January when eleven patrollers from Illinois, Minnesota, and Wisconsin met at Minocqua Winter Park on the morning of January 10. Two patrollers earned senior Nordic ski ability status. On Saturday we practiced all trail skills



along with those being tested. On Sunday Dan Clausen was our instructor for us to advance our striding and skating techniques. On Monday six patrollers practiced Telemark techniques with Dan. He did an excellent job of providing enhancement for skiers with very little experience up to those who were experts. We will meet again probably on January 9, 10, and 11, 2016.

Last Chance OEC Refresher Fall 2015

There will be an OEC refresher at Minocqua Winter Park on Sunday, November 1. This will be a hybrid refresher which means do the on-line exercise and print your certificate. You MUST bring the certificate to the refresher. Details will be available when you register.

OEC Update By: Chris Dobrinski, OEC Administrator

As we move forward into the last half of winter, let's start thinking about the fall refreshers and what we expect to get from our continuing education opportunities. I have overheard many comments about how we are not able to use our skills and training on a year-around basis, and how some of our skills get rusty. Remember, there are several opportunities to maintain our required level of training.

This year's spring meeting at The Waters of Minocqua will include OEC enhancement seminars. If there are topics you would like to see covered, let me know, and we can try to arrange classes that meet your needs and interests.

The fall refreshers are another way we maintain our skill set and competency. This year there will most likely be some on-line (hybrid) refreshers with hands-on skill demonstrations, along with the traditional refreshers. If your hill is not offering the refresher format you would like, check the National course calendar or Powder Lines for an alternative refresher.

NSP will be enhancing the on-line learning platform much like the American Heart Association has progressed with the BLS on-line course, which is now extremely well organized. The first year I viewed the BLS on-line course, it was much like our first NSP on-line refresher. The most recent BLS course I completed on-line was quite impressive, offering many options to enhance learning above the "bare minimum," but was efficient and concise enough not to waste my time. Our NSP leaders are working to provide that same type of learning opportunity for all of us.

I am asking all patrol reps in our region to provide me with the date and time of their refreshers as early as

possible. Quality control requires IT's from outside your local ski area to observe your refresher, provide feedback, and certify that your refresher met minimum course content. This feedback is used to enhance and improve all of the courses offered by NSP as well as future refreshers. When you see an IT providing quality control, please thank them. They are striving to make the whole system better and are not there to bash anyone. These people give extra time and effort (with no mileage or time reimbursement) to certify that your course, exam, or refresher has met the required standards.

North Central Region will be offering a Senior OEC evaluator clinic this coming summer. This is the first evaluator training clinic offered in our Region. Beginning next year, certified evaluators will be required. Current senior patrollers, please step up and become a certified evaluator! Jim Hughes, Mike Olson, and Dave Voelker have already completed certification and will be providing all of us the opportunity to become certified evaluators. Please watch for details and take advantage of this event.

I encourage all of you to take every opportunity to practice your OEC skills. Ask a certified instructor at your hill to run an enhancement clinic. There are many options, and your instructors should be looking for opportunities to present material in order to maintain their instructor certification.

Don't hesitate to contact me with questions, concerns, or suggestions about our OEC program.

Ladies Only TES at Big Powder Horn Mountain By: Nancy Dobrinski



Section Reports

Section Three Report By: Bruce lattoni Section Chief



The 2014/15 ski season is well underway as the ski areas and patrollers in Section 3 are off to a great start. As of the writing of this report, I have had the opportunity to visit some of the ski areas and help with refreshers and candidate classes. For those I have not yet visited, I have talked with the patrol representatives and plan to visit them before the end of the season.

Bruce Mound Recreation Area has recently changed Patrol Representatives. After many years with Scott Loveland as the PR, Joe Hastings is now taking over as their Patrol Rep. Thanks to Scott for all those years of service. This year with the efforts from instructors within the Bruce Mound patrol and the help of others from outside their patrol, they are in the midst of a candidate class with all the candidates successfully passing the OEC and now in the ski and toboggan training.

Granite Peak was able to open this year on November 15, establishing their earliest opening date. Granite Peak Ski Area has reported they are in negotiations with the State of Wisconsin for an approval of a major expansion. They are waiting for that decision. There was not a candidate class this past year, looking to hold one for the 2015-16 season. Coming up on Feb 7, will be a "Know the Patrol" event, giving patrollers a chance to meet and greet the guests and talk about the skier safety code as well as how to contact patrol if needed. Always a fun event.

Navarino Ski/Tubing Area is off to a great start. Many young families come out for a few hours of fun either on skis or to enjoy tubing on the tubing run. A new candidate class is presently underway with the hopes of successfully adding a couple new patrollers to their roster at year end.

The Nine Mile Recreation Area, a Marathon County park just outside Wausau Wisconsin is doing great things with Nordic skiing and snowshoeing. Consisting of just four primary patrollers, the group serves many skier and snowshoe enthusiasts over a trail system that contains 30 kilometers of tracked and groomed trails, and six kilometers of groomed snowshoe trails. In addition to their patrol duties relative to Nine Mile's recreational skiers, the patrol is also responsible for helping out at a number of different races held at Nine Mile. During the 2014-15 season, the patrol provided assistance at the 40th annual Snekkevik Ski Race held in mid-January of this year, which attracted racers from all over Wisconsin and from every age bracket. In addition, the members of the Nine Mile patrol lent their talents to the Wiscon-





sin State Winter Special Olympics Ski and Snowshoe races, which took place on January 24th and 25th at Nine Mile, and which attracted approximately 250 com-

petitors. Finally, the patrol was out in force at the Badger State Games at Nine Mile over the weekend of January 31st, during which Nine Mile hosted numerous races ranging from a 1k kids race all the way up to a 43k American Birkebeiner qualifying race. The patrol also takes pride in assisting Nine Mile's youngest skiers – the "Snow Striders" – who meet for lessons on Sunday afternoons, and range in age from three to nine years old.

Norway Ski Area is off to a great start after being shut down for 2 years. The number of skier visits is gradually coming back. Ralph Hicks, the Patrol Rep has been working hard at getting the patrol up and functioning once again. Pine Mountain, as of writing this report, is in the process of hosting a TES and also hosting a PSIA Ski Enhancement Seminar. Now in his 2nd year as the Patrol Rep for Pine Mtn., Jay Van Zeeland has been working hard at implementing new operational procedures for the patrol. Jay and 4 others have also been working on becoming OET instructors.

Standing Rocks Ski area has not been able to open yet this year due to a lack of snow. In the plans is the possibility for snow making equipment for 2015-16 season to potentially allow for an earlier opening.

That's a wrap up of what is going on at the section 3 ski areas. Hope to see many of you on the slopes this ski season.
