## Section Three Report

The 2015/16 ski season is underway as the ski areas and patrollers in Section 3 are off to a slow, but good start considering the type of weather this year has thrown at us. As of writing this report, the colder weather that is now upon us has allowed many of the areas the ability to make the snow needed to get a good base down for opening additional ski trails.

Granite Peak was able to open this year on November 27 with a couple of runs. Currently about 2/3 of the ski area is open with plans to be 100% open within the very near future. In November, 7 candidates passed the OEC evaluation after spending the last few months in the OEC classes. Currently, all these, "patrollers" are now working on their ski and toboggan skills with high hopes of passing the "on the hill" evaluation in early March. With the anticipation of the expansion of Granite Peak within the next couple of years, GPSP will be holding another candidate class next year.

The Nine Mile Recreation Area is open for the 2015/16 season for cross country skiing and snowshoeing. Saturday January 9 was the date for the Sneekovich ski race that brought in several competitors from throughout the area for some great competition.

Norway Ski Area opened for the season on December 5. Now in the second year of re-opening, night skiing was added and also a tubing run was opened.

Pine Mountain opened on December 26 and is open 7 days a week. They are continuing to work hard at making snow with anticipation to be 100% open very soon. Jay Van Zeeland continues to work with the patrollers, helping and encouraging them to be able to go to a 100% electronic incident management system. This year also brought the addition of a new Medical Director to the patrol, this has helped in the establishment of protocols for directing better and more consistent treatment for the injured while minimizing the different interpretations by various patrollers.

Bruce Mound Recreation Area and the Navarino Ski/Tubing Area are now able to open because of the recent colder temperatures that has enabled enough snow making.

Standing Rocks Ski Area has not been able to open yet this year due to a lack of snow. Plans are still in the works for snow making equipment in the near future.

Hope to see many of you on the slopes this ski season.

4. Must be familiar with Division and Section policies as applicable.

*The above are minimum requirements for nomination.*

#### Recommended Qualifications

1. Served as Patrol Director one year.
2. Logged at least 45 active days patrolling (excluding refreshers, tests, etc.) with at least one third in section.
3. Experience working with management at ski area in the section.
4. Participation in Region activities (meetings, testing/training events, etc.)
5. Should be registered in the Division as senior patroller in any discipline.

#### Duties and Responsibilities

1. Serves term in accordance with Central Division by-laws
2. Supports and fosters NSP mission statement. Promotes NSP education programs with-

in Section to maintain integrity of NSP training and promote efficient delivery/service.

3. Cooperates with Region Director and other NSP officers in maintaining rules, regulations and standards of the NSP.

4. Submits annual activity report to the RD and if necessary financial report to Region Treasurer.

5. Facilitates communication to and from the Region Director, NSP Unit Rep, Ski Area Patrol Rep and NSP members and any other duties assigned by RD or Region Board of Directors.

6. Works cooperatively with NSP Unit Reps to facilitate registration, dues payment and financial reports in a timely manner.

7. Actively participates in Region functions.

8. Maintains Section records as directed by the RD or region policy.

9. Perform as mentor and coach to prospective NSP leaders in Section.

10. Visit each unit in Section annually.

#### Nomination Procedure

Any active patroller in good standing may nominate or make self nomination. Fill out form below and send to Region Elections Coordinator. Form must be post marked by March 14, 2016

#### Electorate

The electorate, having one vote each, consists of Unit Representatives as of December 31, 2015.

**Elections Procedure:** Region Elections Coordinator verifies and notifies all candidates. Ballots will be mailed to eligible voters by March 21, 2016. Ballots must be returned by April 1, 2016. Results will be announced by April 24, 2016.

Not even going to mention it.

What I will talk about, is that it's OK

It's OK that with all of the years of experience your instructors, trainers and leaders in your patrol have under their skis, we will roll on with hill training refreshers and clinics. Let's face it, other than equipment and maybe the color of our uniform not a lot has changed since Minnie Dole was drug off the mountain back in the beginning. No matter the situation we still focus on getting our guests off the mountains and into definitive care.

The Skills Team focus for this season's workshops were to be to return to the basic skills and drills. Skills & drills for ski and riding, basic skills & drills for the operation of rescue toboggans.

For so many, the season hill refreshers may be leaving some patrollers behind in that it has been a very long time since candidate training. Same with hill trainers. They have been doing it for so long they may have developed their own brand. I know I have to go back to the score card every once in a while to make sure I have covered all the evaluation lines so our candidates are prepared.

Now would be a good time to get back to the basics.

- \* Wedge turns
- \* Side slips w/ falling leaf
- \* Transitions
- \* Emergency stop
- \* Traverse w/ kick turn



Run through these drills and see if you still have it. Attend a ski or toboggan enhancement seminar to refresh and get some feedback. Get back to the basics.

So, I am not even going to mention that I am sure glad we have winter back! Stay calm and Ski on!
